Dear Member,

Hello! I am a sheep hunter (make that a fanatical sheep hunter), and my name is Dennis Campbell. But more about me later.

This is Grand Slam Club Newsletter #75, and by now you will have noticed that it has been quite a while since you received your last issue (July 1989). In October 1989, most of you received a notification from Bill Housholder (Bob's brother) and Butch White (Deputy Director) regarding the condition of this club's founder, Bob Housholder. For those of you who did not receive that news, let's go over the details and get an update on Bob's progress thus far.

On September 16, 1989, Bob suffered a serious stroke. It was "touch and go" for quite a while, but Bob is now no longer in danger. However, this illness has taken its toll in other ways. Bob's eyesight and hand coordination is poor at best. He does move around very well with the aid of a walker. On February 23, 1990, his brother Bill moved him from a full nursing home to an intermediate care facility (I'm not sure about the correct term for this type of facility...where I live they are called domicilaries). Bill is not sure how long Bob will be there, but it would be a good idea to continue to pray for Bob's full recovery...as many of you have been, according to the cards and letters you have been sending.

In the letter that Bill Housholder and Butch White sent out to all club members, we were advised that the direction of the Grand Slam Club was in question. It was apparent then...as it is now...that Bob would not be able to continue his work with the Club. We were asked to submit suggestions for the continuance, transfer, etc., of the Club. The overwhelming response was for the Club to continue as closely as possible to the way Bob had developed things. Of course, that meant that (besides keeping records of Grand Slam holders) we wanted the quarterly, down-home style, about sheep, sheep people, sheep topics, sheep problems, guide outfitter suggestions Newsletter to continue. But a big problem presented itself: even though the majority wanted things to continue, only three people volunteered to take over operations.

And, as you have guessed by now, I was chosen. Bill Housholder and I talked about the uniqueness of this Club on several occasions, and we both knew that it would be no easy job to transfer operations. Bill talked with Bob, and they both decided that I should be the designee, if I was still willing to give it a try. (I don't claim to be the best person for this job, but I was tagged, and I'm "It.")

I flew to Phoenix on February 21, 1990, met Bill, and we both went to see Bob. Bob was in good spirits, and it was good to finally get to meet him. Even though I had never met him in person before, but had only communicated by mail, I felt as if I knew him because of those doggoned interesting newsletters. After our meeting at the nursing home, Bill and I went on to Bob's home and the office of the Grand Slam Club.

It took two days to sort through all the records, package them up, and UPS them back to Alabama. The records were in surprisingly great shape for 30 + years' work. I promise to protect these prized photos, letters, hunt reports, all 74 newsletters, Grand Slam records, etc., and have them ready should Bob Housholder become able to continue...or for my future successor.

Now, who the heck is Dennis Campbell? And WHY is he in charge of a Club that boasts Jack O'Connor as Member #1? To the second question, the answer is "by default," but I will try to earn your respect. As for the first question...

Most importantly (as I said in the opening of this letter), I am a sheep hunter. I KNOW what it is to hunt fifteen days in the Canadian Rockies, climbing to the top every day in search of a Stone ram and taking him at 2:00 p.m. on the last day of the hunt (a true 40-incher). I KNOW what it is to work so hard to get to a band of dall rams spotted from miles away that you throw up from exhaustion. I KNOW what it is to backpack hunt all day, finally get up on the rams, decide none are big enough, start the walk back to camp at 6:00 p.m., and arrive in the dark of 1:00 a.m. I even learned this past year what it was to finally draw a lottery tag after applying everywhere for years (I could get used to that feeling!). Bottom Line: I have taken two Stones, 2 dalls, a Rocky Mountain bighorn, and (if it counts) a free-ranging aoudad and mouflon. One of those two Stones makes Boone and Crockett, the bighorn makes Pope & Young, all make Safari Club, and one of the dalls was fourteen years old. I don't like to talk much about myself, I guess it's necessary on this initial get-together...so here goes the technical stuff. First, I reprint my letter to Bill, Butch, and Bob.

Sorry to hear about Bob's health problems. I certainly hope that he will improve and once again return to publishing the unique Grand Slam Club Newsletter. In the event that does not become possible, I submit the following...

Approximately two years ago I sent Bob a proposal concerning the possibility of continuing his work in the event of his inability to do so. Of course I did not receive a reply, since Bob had made it clear that Butch was to be designated for that job. However, I am still interested, inasmuch as Butch is not able to continue.

I have enclosed a profile about myself, and also some examples of my past work. I do not write for a living, but simply as a hobby and for the satisfaction that comes from it. I also feel that I have a "down-home" style of writing, similar to the way Bob has always written.


I am now 38 years old, and began hunting at the age of seven. My hunting consisted primarily of whitetail deer until 1977, when I went on my first out-of-state hunt (taking a 4 x 4 elk on that trip). I guess what I am trying to say is that I am definitely not a newcomer.

I hope that the enclosed profile and examples are ample proof of my ability to organize a club such as the Grand Slam Club. I feel that the Club should continue in much the same direction as Bob has carried it; i.e., I do not feel that it should be "swallowed" by FNAWS (and remember that I am a nine-year member of FNAWS and have attended all but two of their past eight conventions). The Grand Slam Club is unique, and should remain so.

I have put a lot of thought into this idea. I realize that it will take a lot of dedication, with little monetary compensation, since the Club is not built upon a firm financial foundation. However, I have the means to make it go, and I feel that I am up to the task.

* WHEW!*

Now it's time for a little shop talk...you know, that stuff Bob always talked about: what happened to who, when and where and how, and so forth. Old stuff first...

Worth mentioning again that in 1988 Floyd Krank of Aravaipa Outfitters in Arizona showed Art Dubs the biggest desert ram that any human being has ever had the opportunity to legally take...and Art took him! It scored 198 5/8, and is something to behold (I saw him in Reno last year at FNAWS). Dubs has a video out about the hunt and Aravaipa Canyon. I've seen it...not bad!

More on Krank and Aravaipa Canyon: During the 1989 season in Aravaipa, Krank guided Bill Willis to the new #1 Muzzle Loader desert bighorn, which scored 179 3/8. And Jimmie Ryan took the new #1 desert sheep with a bow...its score: 175 1/8. Ryan had bought his permit at the 1989 FNAWS Convention in Reno.

Found a letter on Bob's desk dated March 14, 1989. It seems Heber Simmons Jr., D.D.S. (#202) sent Bob two examples of his invention, the "Heberstrap" (a catchy name). Now, I was given one of these things a couple of years ago, and it is truly a nifty item. (By the way, Simmons did NOT give it to me...I don't even know the guy!) Simply stated, a three-inch-wide rubber-impregnated stretchy strap attaches to the strap of a pair of binoculars, and then is suspender-clipped to the belt or pants in the back. It takes the pressure of the binoculars' weight off of the neck. And it works, too...I have used mine on three sheep hunts. Now, where to get one might be the problem...I bought a camoflauge model at the FNAWS Convention last year, so I assume you can call FNAWS in Cody, Wyoming, and order one (phone # (307) 527-6261).

There was a letter dated December 20, 1989 (after Bob's stroke and the announcement of such) from Davis S. Loos of Minnesota: "I was sitting on top of a mountain in Alberta in September and thought I should write and inform the Club that my father, Sherman Loos (#91) passed away in May of this year. Even near the end, he talked about another sheep hunt. He started sheep hunting when he was 59 and continued until he was 74."

David goes on to say, "I was looking for a larger bighorn, but no luck. Almost 100 days total for bighorns now, and one shot."

Sorry about your dad, David...in my opinion, a person who has been able to hunt sheep and take the Grand Slam has lived a full life. But I know you will still miss him.

Joe Crawley of Baldwin, Missouri, sent a note and photos of his second Slam. Listen, guys and gals...HE DID GOOD!! B.C. bighorn, 169...Yukon dall, 41", absolutely beautiful...42" tremendous Cassiar Mtn. Stone...and a 171 3/8 desert bighorn from Mexico!

Now, let's talk about first-time Grand Slammers: H E L P!!! Possibly just days before Bob's stroke, two guys were scribbled in (poorly...Bob must have been very sick) as member #428, Richard Parker, Texas, and #429, Ronald G. Carlson, Alberta. The problem is, Bob did not add them to the mailing list. As yet, I have not found either of their letters or documentation. PLEASE: if you know these guys, have them write or call me!

The newest two members are Ralph Hilmes, D.D.S., Colorado (#430) (completed in 1982, but just heard about us at the FNAWS Convention last year), and Charles Sibert, West Virginia (#431) (drew a bighorn tag in Wyoming in 1978, and Desert in Nevada in 1989...pays to keep trying for those permits!).

A TIP!! Stone sheep prices have gone out of sight...however, if you know how to hunt with a stick (bow & stick), Dave Coleman of the Yukon, as of a couple of weeks ago, had openings for his bow-only area at \$7500. The bargain is that you can shoot a ram, caribou, moose, and/or anything else he has for no extra charge. HMM? Don't really know the guy personally, but my good friend Danny Moore worked for him one year, and gives him and his area good marks. (Phone (403) 668-5072).

Danny Moore...now there is some kind of guy and guide. I hunted dall with Stan Stevens a couple of years ago, and Danny was my guide. 2 X 1 hunt, and my hunting partner and I took a dall, caribou, and moose apiece (that's six carcasses). Not a complaint out of Danny (except that we could not walk fast enough for him). Anyway, as of the 1989 season, Danny has personally taken or guided hunters to 85 rams...and I think he is only 34 years old! Yours Truly is supposed to help him publish a book when he gets to #100. He has maintained records on all of the sheep...book title: 100 Full Curls, probably to be published in 1992 or 1993.

I had the pleasure of running into John Caputo, Jr. at the airport after my hunt for Stone in B.C. last year. Then, while packing up the Club records, ran into a couple of photos he sent to Bob. He took some rams in the early years that make my eyes bug out.

There was another photo...an 8 x 16 (not 8 x 10) horizontal of "Corley's Mountain." In case you don't know, that was a special display created for Boone & Crockett's 100th Anniversary in Dallas a couple of years ago. Words do little justice for it...48 + full body mounts of North American species, with no duplications. I was there in Dallas and saw it myself...know it had to cost a fortune for Don Corley (#219) to do it, but lots of people were able to enjoy it. Thanks, Don!!

While in Phoenix to pack up Club records, I drove down to Tucson and went by the SCI International Wildlife Museum and offices. I was treated very well by magazine editor Bill Quimby...he showed me around the ultra-modern circular office facilities and introduced me to most of the staff. Met Libby Grimes, who is the brains responsible for all those thousands and thousands of animals in the SCI Record Books...50,000, I think she said. The museum is worth seeing, too: it is tastefully done, and there is a big mountain with most world species of sheep and goats. A nice place.

I also visited the Sonora Desert Museum outside Tucson...it is actually a zoo, rather than a museum. Know what I enjoyed the most? No, you missed it...not the desert sheep (they were too scraggly looking). No, it was the hummingbirds...several species in one large enclosure. All of the animals are or were indigenous to Arizona.

About the time you get this newsletter it will be too late to apply for bighorn in Wyoming. The deadline is March 15 each year. If you missed it, you should remember that next year. Frankly, the odds are pretty good on drawing...just under 10% in some areas for non-residents. There are several good sheep guides in Wyoming that specialize in particular areas. Just a little investigation will yield a quality hunt at half of what it costs in Alberta and B.C. Rams might not average as big as Alberta, but are generally bigger than the B.C. California species.

Finally, let's talk about other states and their deadlines for applying for Bighorns and Desert:

ARIZONA (DESERT SHEEP)

The application period runs from the end of May to the end of June. To request regulations and applications, contact the Arizona Game & Fish Department, 2222 West Greenway Road, Phoenix, AZ 85023, (602) 942-3000.

CALIFORNIA (DESERT SHEEP)

Only one non-resident permit. For more information, contact the California Department of Fish & Game, 1416 Ninth Street, Box 944209, Sacramento, CA 94244, (916) 342-8328.

COLORADO (ROCKY MOUNTAIN BIGHORN)

Colorado also offers some fine bighorn sheep hunting. Drawing odds are good, and you can compile points for applying year after year. The deadline for applying for sheep hunts is April 17, with the drawing held May 9. For more information, contact the Colorado Department of Natural Resources, Division of Wildlife, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216, (303) 297-1192.

IDAHO (ROCKY MOUNTAIN BIGHORN)

In Idaho, you have to buy a non-refundable license just to apply (\$85.00). Drawing odds are pretty good, however. Deadline for applications is April 30. For more information, contact the Idaho Fish & Game Department, 600 South Walnut, Box 25, Boise, ID 83707, (208) 334-3700.

MONTANA (ROCKY MOUNTAIN BIGHORN)

Application deadline is June 1, 1990. There are some big sheep in Montana, and odds of drawing are not good. For more information on regulations and applications, contact the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, 1420 East Sixth, Helena, MT 59620, (406) 444-2950.

NEVADA (DESERT SHEEP)

Deadline for application is usually the last week of May. You should be applying in this state if you want a desert sheep. For more information, contact the Nevada Department of Wildlife, P.O. Box 10678, Reno, NV 89520, (702) 789-0500.

NEW MEXICO

The deadline for applying for New Mexico permits is usually mid-April. The drawing is held in June. The applications from residents and non-residents both go together for the eleven sheep tags in New Mexico. No desert permits are available here...only Rocky Mt. Bighorn. For more information on applications and regulations, contact the New Mexico Game & Fish Department, Villagra Building, Santa Fe, NM 87503, (505) 827-7899.

OREGON

The deadline for applying for permits in Oregon is usually April 1. Non-residents pay \$100.50 for a hunting license; license fees are not refundable. For more information, contact the Oregon Department of Fish & Wildlife, P.O. Box 59, Portland, OR 97207, (503) 229-5477. NOTE: Oregon will auction a Bighorn tag on May 5, 1990, at the Hilton Hotel in Eugene, Oregon. For more information, call James North at (503) 779-6610, or Mike Boyce in Reno, Nevada. Last year's tag was purchased by Peter Bollinger, and he took a bruiser bighorn: 200 5/8 B&C.

UTAH (DESERT SHEEP)

Application information is available on May 1, and the application deadline is at the end of May. The drawing is held June 29. Hunters must purchase a big game hunting license before applying for tags. The non-resident fee is \$120. For more information, contact the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources, 1596 West North Temple, Salt Lake City, UT 84116, (801) 533-9333.

WASHINGTON

The deadline for applications is early July. Application information will be available in early June. Both residents and non-residents must purchase a hunting license prior to applying. The non-resident fee is \$125.00 and is non-refundable. For additional information, contact the Washington Department

of Wildlife, 600 Capitol Way North, Olympia, WA 98501, (206) 753-5700.

Did I miss any states? I sure hope not.

Well, I promise that this lengthy thing will end with this next item... maybe. **DUES:** Now, you should have caught on by this time that this newsletter went out at my expense. This Club **must** be built on a firm financial foundation. Please pay 1990 dues **NOW** by return mail! 
